" And where did you come from?" asked Little Ole.


"The stork brought me," answered Lena.

Rhubarb Bars

Crust:

₹1½ cups flour

§ 1/4 cup powder sugar

3/4 cup butter (cold but cut into cubes)

Mix above dry ingredients and then mix in butter until crumbly, press into a 9X13 greased pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 10 to 12 minutes until lightly browned.

While baking mix:

3 eggs

2 cups sugar

½ cup flour

½ teaspoon salt

Mix above, then add 4 cups rhubarb small pieces)

While crust is still warm pour above mixture over and return to oven.

Reduce heat to 325 ° and bake 30 to 35 minutes until filling is set and rhubarb is soft when cut in with knife.
