




- 16 oz. unsalted peanuts (or dry roasted peanuts)
- 16 oz. salted cocktail peanuts
- 1 (12 ounce bag) semisweet chocolate chips
- 1 (12 ounce bag) milk chocolate chips
- 2 (10 ounce bags) peanut butter chips
- 1 (16 ounce packages) white almond bark or vanilla candy melts.

Layer all of the ingredients in order in a large slow cooker. Start with the peanuts. Cover and cook on low for 2 hours. Remove the lid and stir to combine. Replace lid and leave for 30 minutes. Spoon onto wax
