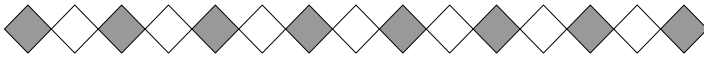

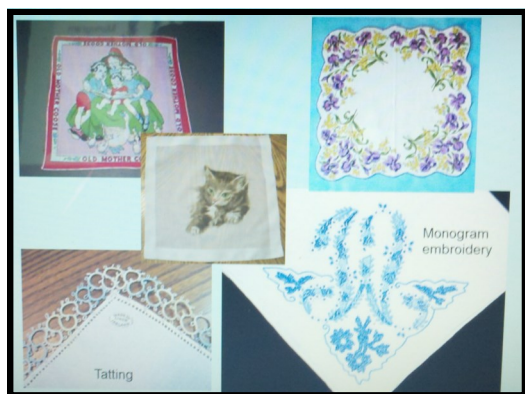


I attended the conference with my daughter. We went on the Kohler Design Center and the Plymouth Wreath Factory tour. I thought the wreath making class was

Soup or Sauce (SOS) Mix

- 2 Cups powdered non-fat dry milk
- 3/4 Cup Cornstarch
- 1/4 Cup instant chicken bouillon
(reg. or low Sodium)
- 2 Tbsps. dried onion flakes
- 2 Tsp. Italian seasoning (optional)

Directions

Combine all ingredients in a recloseable plastic bag, mixing well.

Yield

Equal to 9 (10.5oz) cans of cream soup

Storage

Store in closed plastic bag or air-tight container until ready to use. It does not have to be refrigerated.
