The agenda for the meeting was adopted and the minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. The Treasurer's report was read and placed on file for review.

Correspondence: Carol Sybeldon read announcements about the Shawano County Brunch on the Farm in June and also the Sam25 Brat Fry fund raisers during the summer at the Franklin Park. Helen Raddant read the verse for the thank you card she sent to the Shawano Women's Club for their donation.

Committee Reports were given by Carol Sybeldon, Center 1 Chairman, Sandra Smith, Center 2 Chairman, and Ellie Borre, Center 3 Chairman. Sandy Wendorff reported on the Patti-Pumpkin Seed Project. The seeds have been distributed. Sandy gave out forms for Early Readers Literacy Project Proposal concerning the Bookworms program.
