Being a Master Gardener is about becoming a VOLUNTEER with the University of Wisconsin-Extension to help educate the public about gardening and

Training:

• Becoming a Master Gardener Volunteer begins with Level 1 Training. Level 1 training introduces you to a broad range of horticultural topics and familiarizes you with research-based information related to gardening. You'll learn how to answer gardening questions and develop skills such as motivating others to garden. Topics include but are not limited to growing fruits and vegetables, landscaping with woody plants, working in community gardens, horticultural therapy, and invasive and native plants.

Volunteering:

 Master Gardener Volunteers complete 24 hours of volunteer service every year plus 10 hours of continuing education to be certified.
